Title: Entrepreneurship in The Context of Crowdfunding: Systematic Literature Review, Power-Law Perspective, and Technology Focus

Abstract: The overarching research question of this dissertation is: what factors drive the emergence of outliers in entrepreneurship? I investigate this question in three essays within the context of crowdfunding. Using a power law perspective—which proposes that a set of factors nonlinearly drives the outcomes that follow the power law distributions—I hypothesize that the primary mechanism driving "normal" outcomes differs from the mechanism driving outlier outcomes. Leveraging data from Kickstarter, I test these hypotheses with partially linear additive quantile regression and fuzzy set qualitative comparative analysis. This dissertation will significantly contribute to the literature on human capital, social capital, technology ventures, and crowdfunding.
